"I Have My Treasures With Me"

Anchor Verse

"Behold, I am coming soon, bringing my reward with me, to repay each one for what he has done." — Revelation 22:12 (ESV)

INTRODUCTION: THE KING WHO RETURNS BEARING GIFTS

Imagine a king returning from battle, BUT he is not empty-handed. He returns with spoils -goodness, justice, and generosity in hand.

He is not weary, though the journey has been long. He is not indifferent, though centuries have passed. He is near, deliberate—and personal. He is the Lord Jesus.

This is not a parable.

This is not a dream.

This is His voice echoing from the final chapter of the Scriptures:

"I am bringing my reward with me". When he spoke to me this message, he told me: "I have My treasures with Me."

Meditate on this:

the same Jesus who said "I am with you always" which is the message of these series is also the One who says: "I have My treasures with Me."

What Can we learn from these words of the Lord? Here are some 3 revelations:

1. A RETURN THAT IS CERTAIN AND PERSONAL

He says: "Behold, I am coming soon..."

In a world filled with delay, detours, and doubt, Jesus doesn't speak with hesitation. He says, "I am coming." Not I might, not I'll see.

He speaks with divine certainty.

Now, the phrase "I am coming" is repeated in the book of Revelation multiple times—chapter after chapter. It is His final promise, a personal assurance to the Church:

"I am not distant. I have not forgotten. I will not delay forever."

When the Lord Jesus was leaving this earth, as the disciples watched Him ascend from the Mount of Olives, the angels assured them:

"This same Jesus... will return in the same way" (Acts 1:11).

Not a metaphor. Not a spirit. This same Jesus.

He who walked with you in the storm...

He who stood with you in the fire...

He who whispered comfort in the silence...

He is coming again.

The second thing we can see is this:

2. A REWARD THAT IS REAL AND RIGHTEOUS

The verse goes on to say: "...bringing my reward with me, to repay each one for what he has done."

This is not Santa Claus with a bag of toys, nor karma in disguise.

This is the righteous Judge returning with an intentional, perfect, and just reward.

The word used for "reward" in the original Greek is misthos — a term that means wages, compensation, or payment due.

In other words, Jesus is saying, "I am coming to personally repay and honor the work of every faithful servant."

But this is no ordinary payment.

It includes:

- The joy of the Master (Matthew 25:21)
- The crown of righteousness (2 Timothy 4:8)
- Authority to reign with Him (Revelation 3:21)

His reward is:

- Present with Him - "with Me"

- Personal "each one"
- Precise "for what he has done"

Beloved, not a single tear, not a single hour, not a single act of faith will be forgotten.

Even a cup of cold water in His name will not lose its reward (Matthew 10:42).

A PERSONAL TESTIMONY: "LORD, REMEMBER US"

My wife and I, when we pray, we often say:

"Lord Jesus, remember us like Mordecai, whom the king finally remembered after a long time."

In Esther 6, the king could not sleep, and he asked for the record books to be brought to him. And when they were read aloud, he discovered what Mordecai had done years earlier. The king asked:

"What has been done for Mordecai?"

And the servants replied:

"Nothing has been done."

But that night... everything changed.

I believe the Lord Jesus will also return and ask:

"What was done for Mary? For James? For Richard?"

And the angels may reply:

"Nothing yet, my Lord."

And then the King of Kings will smile, and say:

"Then let it be done now."

I pray when the Lord comes, He will remember you. That He will check the records and release the treasure He's been keeping just for you.

The Final thing we can see from the verse is this:

3. A MOTIVATION FOR FAITHFULNESS UNTIL THE END

This verse is not meant to provoke fear but to stir faithfulness.

In a world that celebrates shortcuts, compromise, and applause from men, we are called to live for the unseen reward—to finish well, not just start with passion.

Paul said it clearly:

"Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest..." (Galatians 6:9)

This is our anchor:

Christ is coming.

Our labor is not in vain.

He is watching.

And He is rewarding.

WALK WITH THE TREASURE CARRIER

In all your work, you are not walking toward emptiness.

You are walking with the One who said, "I am with you always."

And the One who says, "I have My treasures with Me."

Let the hope of His return:

- Purify your motives
- Persevere in hardship
- Propel you to finish the race

And when He comes—whether in the stillness of the midnight hour or brightness of the high noon sun—may He find you faithful.

But for others of you – you are not yet sure if he will find you faithful. For you I say this:

You've heard His promise:

"I have My treasures with Me."

But the greatest treasure of all... is salvation itself.

This means to be **forgiven**, to be **filled with His Spirit**, and to be **welcomed** when He returns.

So I ask you sincerely:

• Have you given your life to Jesus?

- Have you accepted the treasure of eternal life?
- If He were to come today... would you be ready?

If not, today is your day. This moment is for you.

Pray this with me now to receive Him:

"Lord Jesus, I believe You died for me and rose again. I confess I am a sinner. Please forgive me. Fill me with Your Holy Spirit and make me Your witness. I give You my life. In Jesus' name. Amen."
