### Introduction

#### **Isaiah 62:6–7**

*"On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen; all the day and all the night they shall never be silent. You who put the Lord in remembrance, take no rest, and give Him no rest until He establishes Jerusalem and makes it a praise in the earth."*

And now the Spirit says:

I have set watchmen.

Sound the alarm.

Lift the trumpet.

Cry aloud – without rest, day and night!

### 1. The Watchmen

Isaiah says: *"On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen."*

Not sleepers.

Not cowards.

Not entertainers.

Watchmen.

And their call?

*"They shall never be silent."*

**Ezekiel 33:6–7** warns us:

*"If the watchman sees the sword coming and does not blow the trumpet... his blood I will*

*require at the watchman's hand. But if he blows the trumpet and warns the people... he has delivered his soul."*

So I declare:

**The sword is coming.**

**Judgment is at the door.**

**On your walls, O Jerusalem — do not be silent!**

## 2. The Walls of Holiness

Why walls?

Nehemiah wept when he saw them broken.

Walls mean protection.

Walls mean identity.

Walls mean separation unto God.

When the walls fall, the enemy floods in.

When the walls stand, the city is secure.

So church — rebuild the walls.

- Holiness.
- Truth.
- Prayer.
- Fasting.

These are the walls that keep us awake for the trumpet call.

These are the walls that keep us ready for the Bride Groom.

## 3. John the Baptist, the Watchman

There was a man sent from God, his name was John.

A watchman in the wilderness.

A voice crying: *"Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight his paths!"*

He was the friend of the Bridegroom.

He heard the footsteps before anyone else.

And he cried: *"Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"*

John was not silent.

He called sin by its name.

He pointed to the Bridegroom.

This generation needs Johns.

Where are the watchmen?

Where are the voices crying in the wilderness?

The Bridegroom is coming.

The King is at the door.

#### 4. The Trumpet Must Sound

**Joel 2:1** says:

*"Blow a trumpet in Zion; sound an alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming; it is near."*

And **Joel 2:15** adds:

*"Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly."*

So I say:

**Blow the trumpet.**

**Sound the alarm.**

**Consecrate a fast.**

The day of the Lord is coming.

It is near.

**Jesus warned in Matthew 24:12:**

*"Because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold."*

**Peter said in 2 Peter 3:3–4:**

*"Scoffers will come in the last days... saying, 'Where is the promise of His coming?'"*

**Paul declared in Romans 1:21, 24–25:**

*"Though they knew God, they did not honor Him as God... so God gave them up to impurity... they exchanged the truth about God for a lie."*

Look around our world today — can you not see it?

Lawlessness abounds.

Hearts grow cold.

Truth is mocked.

Men exchange the truth of God for a lie.

But in the middle of this darkness, Jesus still says: *"Behold, I come quickly."*

When the watchman sounds the trumpet, the fire of God falls. A holy fire — fire that burns away compromise, fire that sets the church ablaze.

So again I cry:

**Wake up, Zion — the King is coming!**

#### 5. The Warnings

Remember Lot's wife!

She looked back and perished.

Do not look back. Do not turn back.

Remember Ananias!

He lied to the Holy Spirit and fell dead (Acts 5).

Do not pretend. Do not lie to God.

Remember the 10 virgins.  
Only those with oil entered (Matthew 25).  
Be ready. Be watchful. Be filled.

Remember the faithful servant (Matthew 24:46).  
Blessed was the one found working when the Master returned.

Do not slumber.  
Do not scoff.  
Do not delay.

Remember: Eternity is one breath away. One heartbeat between now and forever. One trumpet blast, and time will be no more.

## 6. The Hope of the Watchman

**Malachi 3:16–17** says:

*"Those who feared the Lord spoke with one another. The Lord paid attention and heard them, and a book of remembrance was written before Him... They shall be mine, says the Lord, in the day when I make up my treasured possession."*

God sees His watchmen.  
God hears their cries.  
God remembers those who stand on the wall —  
in prayer,  
in fasting,  
**in tears.**

He will not forget you.  
He will come.  
He will reward you.

Watchmen are not just guarding walls — they are crying for souls at the gate. Who will stand in the gap? Who will weep between the porch and the altar? (Joel 2:17).

## 7. The Final Trumpet

**Revelation 22:12:**

*"Behold, I am coming soon, and My reward is with Me."*

The trumpet is sounding.  
The walls are shaking.  
The King is coming.

So I leave you with this refrain:

**On your walls, O Jerusalem — do not be silent.  
Do not grow weary.  
The King is coming!**

### Altar Call & Prayer

So I ask you:

Will you take your place on the wall?

Will you be a John the Baptist in this generation?

Will you watch and pray until the Bridegroom comes?

And if you are here and your heart is far from God —  
this is your moment.

Do not look back like Lot's wife.

Do not lie to the Spirit like Ananias.

Do not be found without oil like the foolish virgins.

Come to Jesus.

Father, seal every heart that will pray this prayer.

Write their names in the Book of Life.

Set them as watchmen on the walls.

Pray with me:

### Altar Call Prayer

Lord God Almighty,  
we exalt You as the Holy One of Israel,  
the Keeper of Zion,  
the Bridegroom who is coming again.  
You are worthy of all praise, honor, and glory.

And now, Lord, we pray for every soul that is not ready for Your coming.

Lord Jesus, I come to You tonight.

I repent of my sins.

I believe You died for me and rose again.

Wash me with Your blood.

Fill me with Your Spirit.

Make me ready for Your return.

From this day, I will follow You.

In Jesus' name. Amen.
